Bright future for MCF graduate

My name is Gabriel Matheka and I was born in a family of 5 children with 3 sisters and 1 brother. My father died in 1993 and my mother died in 1995 of HIV/AIDS. After their death, no one was there to care for us, not even our relatives. We were depressed from the death of our parents and emaciated from the lack of food.

We all dropped out of school, and I was forced to do child labour at the age of 9 to feed my small sisters. Our situation seemed hopeless. Then in December 1995, Charles Mulli heard our story and he rescued us and welcomed us into the Mully Children's Family.

When we came to MCF, our basic needs like food, were taken care of. We got education and counselling; we were taught the Word of God; and we received parental love from Charles and Esther.

When I graduated from the MCF high school in 2003, I went to college in Nairobi and then started my own retail business

that I have been running for the last six years. My sisters are also in Nairobi working on their studies and it is through them that I met my wife Jenn Chaves, a Canadian who worked at MCF on a CIDA internship in 2005.

This fall, we celebrated the Mully Children's Family's 20th Anniversary by bringing 20 members of the MCF Mission Choir across Canada as part of a North American Safari tour.

The team travelled from Toronto to Vancouver, with over 111 presentations, covering 5 provinces and well over 7,000 km in 58 days.

It was a one-of-a-kind show that had audiences grooving in their seats and jumping to their feet for standing ovations. The youth shared their stories of transformation and the hope they now have and it was this message that touched hearts and inspired audiences across the country.

When I look back at my time in MCF, I am grateful that I was equipped with a good education and taught to work hard in whatever I'm doing. It was at MCF that I became a Christian and learned to trust in God and to be a responsible person.

My goals for the future are to support many young people and children to realize their dreams and succeed in life. I am looking forward to having a happy and beautiful family and seeing my sisters and my brother and their families be happy and successful in life.

Said's Story

I

Said Kiptoo is the last born in a family of six siblings. His father was an abusive drunkard and mistreated them and their mother. In 1999 his parents separated and his father abandoned them, leaving them in the care of their poor unemployed mother. His father later died of alcohol abuse and his mother was forced to engage in all manner of trade to provide for Said and his siblings.

Said's mother died in 2007 after a

long illness leaving the children with no one to turn to for help. They had to drop out of school to fend for themselves in the streets. Said was only 8 years old.

In March 2007 MCF rescued Said and his brother from the streets. Ever since they were rescued from the hard life and the risks they were facing, the brothers have been full of cheer and praise for God. His elder two siblings had already been rescued by MCF in 1999. Said was not attending school at the time of rescue. He is now in grade two and is progressing well with his studies.
